This application process is open to all Pewaukee High School students with an expected graduation date of June 2023 and a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50. The decisions on these scholarships are based entirely on this application, filled out by the applying student. Scholarships are awarded at the PHS Kiwanis Senior Class Honors Banquet in April, 2023.

The decisions of the PHS Booster Club committee are final and are based on a combination of the following criteria:

School / community service and involvement (on a volunteer basis)

Leadership in student / athletic activities

Sportsmanship and school spirit

Character and good citizenship

Student essay

Accepted or acceptance pending at an institute of higher learning

Applicants interested in applying for these scholarships should complete the following application, include a PDF of an official transcript as of the end of 1st semester senior year, submit completed essay, and forward all forms/documents by 8:00 pm **Saturday**, **February 11th**, **2023**
